Subject Personal Pronouns

Personal pronouns replace nouns so we don't have to repeat the same names or objects in every sentence. In English, subject pronouns show who or what is performing the action.

I and We: Use 'I' for yourself, and 'we' for yourself plus other people.

You: Use 'you' for the person you are talking to, whether it is one person or a group of people.

He and She: Use 'he' to replace the name of a man, and 'she' to replace the name of a woman.

It: Use 'it' for a singular object, an animal, or general conditions like the weather and time.

They: Use 'they' for plural people, animals, or things.
