

Present Perfect Exercises

Level: A2, B1

How the present perfect works

The present perfect connects the past to the present: it describes experiences, changes, and situations that started in the past and still matter now.

Form: have/has + past participle (I have worked, she has gone)

Use 1 — Experience: Things you have done at some time in your life: "I have visited Japan."

Use 2 — Unfinished time: Situations that started in the past and continue now, often with for/since: "She has lived here since 2020."

Use 3 — Present result: Past actions with a visible result now: "I have lost my keys (so I can't get in)."

Signal words: ever, never, just, already, yet, for, since, recently, so far
